*The New York Times* lauded Jason Vieaux as one of the "youngest stars of the guitar world." His 2009 release, *Bach: Works for the Lute, Vol. 1*, debuted on Billboard's Classical Chart at #13. In 2003, *Sevilla: The Music of Isaac Albeniz*, was named one of the top ten classical CDs of the year.
